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Rights and Responsibilities as a Resident of Long Term Care

When a person enters a Long Term Care facility it becomes their home. Each resident has his or her own wants and needs and has rights and responsibilities that always need to be considered.

- Residents have the right to be treated with politeness, respect, and free from abuse, neglect and also have the responsibility to treat others in the same manner.
- 2 Residents have the right to have their own belongings as long as it is safe for them and others, including managing their own money when they are able.
- **3** Residents have the right to privacy in all aspects of their life including their personal health information.
 - Residents have the right to direct their own care and have the right to accept or refuse care when it does not negatively impact other residents and staff.
- 5 Residents have the right to take part in social activities that they enjoy and are able to do, including outdoor activities.
- 6 Residents and their families who live in a shared room have the right to privacy.
 - Residents have the right to die at the Home in the presence of their families and friends if they so choose.
 - Residents have the right to know about any guidelines at the Home which my impact them.
- 9 Residents can offer any complaints, concerns, compliments and suggestions in a confidential matter and no action will be taken to evict, discharge or intimidate a resident who makes a complaint.
 - Upon admission to a long term care home, residents are informed how to resolve a concern or complaint are provided with the contact information about who to contact with their concern or complaint.
